FROM THE HEAD

Dear Parents

Monday 2 September was a very special day as we gathered together for the first time as the three schools (ELS, Preparatory and College) in a common celebration of our third birthday as Reddam House Umhlanga.

Some of our parents and students might not know that our school was not always known as Reddam House Umhlanga. From 2003 until August 2016 it was known as Umhlanga College - a small, caring co-educational independent school - known for always "punching above its weight" - it earned its place amongst the best independent schools in KZN. However, circumstances were such that, by 2016, it would need considerable investment for the school to be able to continue to compete against the best schools and this is why, following a sale agreement between the Board of Umhlanga College and the Inspired Group, our school changed its name officially on 1 September 2016 to Reddam House Umhlanga.

Although this is only our third birthday as Reddam House Umhlanga, this year marks 20 years since the establishment of the first Reddam House school in Constantia, Cape Town. Today we are proud to be a part of a brotherhood and sisterhood of four Reddam House schools in the Cape, three in Johannesburg, two in the United Kingdom and another, Reddam House Ballito, joined us in KZN at the start of this year. There are considerable benefits to being a part of a network of schools that share a similar educational ethos and we have only just begun to explore the exciting possibilities.

Our junior and senior girls' and boys' waterpolo teams, for example, spent last weekend competing in the first Reddam House Aquatic Games at Reddam House Helderfontein involving our brother and sister schools in Gauteng. There was much comradery and healthy rivalry as all the Reddam House schools present were able to derive benefit of being involved in coaching clinics conducted by US two-time Olympic gold medal winner, Maggie Staffens. This opportunity was only available to waterpolo players who attend a Reddam House school. Similar sporting opportunities are currently being planned in other sports and will take place from next year at Reddam House schools around the country. Likewise we are also exploring the possibility of hosting cultural festivals involving Music, Drama, Art and Dance.

Our teachers also gain additional benefits from being able to link up with like-minded teachers of the same subject at other Reddam House schools around the country. This has real benefit when it comes to sharing resources and ideas as well as moderation of assessments. Furthermore, being a part of the Inspired Global Educational group that currently consists of 53 schools around the world, means that our staff can draw on international best practice and educational trends. From next year our College students will also be able to take advantage of the international exchange opportunities that exist between schools in our international network.

By being a part of both a local and international network of schools undoubtedly goes a long way to inspiring true excellence in international education and be able to best prepare our students to be global citizens of tomorrow.

Skorts, Blazers & General Appearance

The parents of the girls whose skorts were 'a little too short have been communicated with, and we wish to thank these parents for the positive manner in which this communication was received. This serves as a reminder that the skorts of Grades 8, 10, 11 and 12 girls must be lengthened by Friday 6 September, Grade 9 girls by Friday 20 September (These girls were away at Ndlela when the initial check was carried out) and boarders by the first day of Term 4.

It has come to light that some girls opted to wear a longer pair of skorts on the day the inspection was carried out, so as to avoid "coming onto our radar". These girls have since reverted to wearing their shorter skorts. Please be aware that monitoring of skorts lengths is on-going and that parents may be contacted at any time to remedy this. Please assist us by checking your daughter's skorts yourself. If the skorts are not visible from the back, when the blazer is worn, or are only just visible, then they are unacceptably short.

Please remember that a second hand uniform shop is operational two afternoons a week on the College campus, should you prefer not to have to purchase a brand new item. Remaining on the topic of uniforms, we are concerned that many students have buttons missing from their blazers. Please can parents assist us by checking their child's blazer and having missing buttons replaced.

We have also noticed that some of the boys have hair that is unacceptably long. The hair must be a short, "school boy" cut and must follow the natural shape of the head. Thank you for assisting us to maintain the highest standards of appearance.


