FROM THE HEAD

Dear Parents

The moving and memorable Matric Induction Ceremony took place on Tuesday 4 February in the Mini Theatre. During the ceremony, the seven leadership portfolios were formally introduced. These are as follows: Culture, Green, Outreach, Public Relations/Marketing, School Spirit, Sport and Student Support Council. The chairperson of each of the portfolios delivered the mission statement for the portfolio and the members of each were presented with their certificates, badges and Matric ties. The formal ceremony was followed by a cocktail party in the College Functions Room.

At Reddam House Umhlanga we believe that every student possesses leadership potential and deserves the opportunity to show their leadership potential. We also believe that every future Matric student can play a leadership role in steering the direction of our College and should, at the end of their Matric year, leave proud in the knowledge that the College is a little better because of the role that they have played in its leadership. I wish to thank each and every member of our Matric Class of 2020 for agreeing to dedicate their talents and their time to serving on these portfolios. I know that they have chosen these portfolios based on their passions and their sense of purpose. I have every faith that they will lead with confidence and compassion - never seeking to exercise power or privilege.

Servant leadership is a concept that was first coined by Robert Greenleaf in 1970. A servant-leader focuses primarily on the growth and well-being of people and the communities to which they belong. While traditional leadership generally involves the accumulation and exercise of power by one at the "top of the pyramid," servant leadership is different. The servant-leader shares power, puts the needs of others first and helps people develop and perform as highly as possible.

The concept of servant-leader has been expanded upon through the recent work of Brene Brown, the research professor of social work at the University of Houston, and the author of the best-selling <u>Dare to Lead</u>. Brown defines a leader as being "anyone who takes responsibility for finding the potential in people and processes and who has the courage to develop that potential."

In her two decade long research, Brown believes that we need braver leaders and more courageous cultures for modern organisations to flourish and innovate. This is particularly true in the world today where there is a widespread lack of confidence in leadership generally - be it in business, government, sports teams – pretty much everywhere.

According to Brown, when we dare to lead, we don't pretend to be the "best" leader or believe that we have all the answers. When we dare to lead, we stay curious and ask the right questions. We don't see power as finite and hoard it. We know that power becomes infinite when we share it with others.

It takes great courage in daring to lead. But to have courage, you need to make yourself vulnerable. Vulnerability is "the universal emotion we feel when times are risky and uncertain or we are at the mercy of other people's actions." According to Brene Brown, the most critical aspect of courageous leadership is choosing how to respond to fear: in the face of anger, disappointment, rejection or hate: how will you respond? Will you go into autopilot and seek to protect yourself by blaming others? Or will you seek to try and exert control over others? Or will you people please and appease?

There can be no better example of a servant leader who dared to lead than Nelson Mandela who, in his autobiography <u>Long Walk to Freedom</u> wrote: "I learnt that courage was not the absence of fear, but the triumph over it. The brave man is not he who does not feel afraid, but he who conquers that fear." Sometimes the bravest and most important thing you can do is just to show up!

My hope is that at the end of this year, the Matric Class of 2020 will be able to look back and know that they contributed more than they criticised. I trust that they will lead as examples of values-based servant leadership and will live out our motto of "We Shall Give Back."

Due to the inclement weather, we have postponed today's Annual Interhouse Swimming Gala to next week, Friday 14 February. The gala will start at 10:15 following normal Friday morning lessons and a Valentine's Day Assembly hosted by the SSC. The Student Support Council is currently selling roses to College students who wish to purchase them for distribution to their peers on 14 February. Parents are invited to support the gala. Please be reminded to bring peak caps and sunscreen as shaded seating will be at a premium.

Students are to arrive at school on Friday 14 February in their house shirts, PE shorts and slops or takkies. In addition, the swimmers are to wear their Reddam House swimming costumes under their house shirts and PE shorts so that we can start the gala timeously. They are to also bring to school their PE shirt into which they will change at the conclusion of the gala.

The Press Club will be running a tuckshop from within the pool enclosure which will only be selling sweets, chips, chocolates and cool drinks. 
